## Facts

British brown ale has been around since the 18th century. In the past, the malt for the production was still roasted over an open fire and was thus smokier than today's Brown Ale.

Originally, stouts & porters were first dubbed Brown Ale, especially those that were not roasted as heavily. It wasn't until controlled roasting was introduced that the style of British Brown Ale was precisely defined.

A British Brown Ale is a brown top-fermented beer with a subtle hop note, which can also give off a slight bitterness at times. However, aromas from the malt such as caramel, cookie or bread dominate.
