The beer style of porter originated in London. The Porter was at the beginning of the

18th century the favorite beer of porters at the port (the porter) and that is how the beer got its name.

The porter became a popular beer style in the 19th century and was also used for export. However, by the beginning of the 20th century, it lost so much of its importance that by 1970 almost no porter was brewed. It wasn't until the start of the craft beer movement that the style came back to life.

There is only a fine line between a porter and a stout. A porter is a good drinkable beer with a balanced body. There is definitely a certain roasted profile here, reminiscent of coffee and cocoa. In the background, one tastes a very slight bitterness with a few hop aromas.
